Art 493: Professional Dispositions in Art Education

This course is designed to engage students in the development of professional dispositions and preparation of being an effective and productive art educator. Students participate in local and national professional organizations, network with practicing educators, hone philosophy statements and understandings, maintain a professional website, develop and utilize professional resources, mentor a local TED-Ed club, and carefully hone their presentation skills.

WHAT is ARTed Talks?

ARTed Talks began in 2014 with a single participant; A lone art education student who bravely asked: What's my passion? Now, ARTed Talks is a yearly event highlighting the work and passion of juniors and seniors in Art Education at Miami University. The model for the preparation and design is from the world-renowned series, TED (see TED.com) and TEDx that follow the TED Global Conference model. They extend the ideal of "ideas worth spreading." We engage in this practice because each and every voice matters; and everyone has a story to tell.

WHY ARTed Talks?

- Effective educators participate in the advocacy of their field with a clear and focused voice.
- TED-style talks require multiple modes of thinking and practice.
- Art Teachers matter and their experiences should be shared to further learning in the field.
